Mike Hoffman 00:51 Hi there.

Julie Wheaton 00:51 It's where we interview students at Graceland who are connected to Community of Christ.

Mike Hoffman 00:55 Julie, how are you today?

Julie Wheaton 00:57 I'm good. Really good.

Mike Hoffman 01:00 What can you tell us about our guest today?

Julie Wheaton 01:02 This is Adric Williams.

Adric Williams 01:03 Hello.

Julie Wheaton 01:04

Adric is on Cheville now. He is a freshman. And he does a whole bunch of things here, don't you?

Adric Williams 01:11

Oh, yeah.

Mike Hoffman 01:13

So that's part of, I think, why we decided to have Adric with us. Adric actually works on the campus ministries team. But so, we're going to ask you a few things about yourself. So, Julie said you're a freshman. So, I know a little bit about your major. So, how would you describe your major that you're pursuing?

Adric Williams 01:30

My hobby for a long time has been composing music. So here at Graceland, I am majoring in what's called interdisciplinary studies with a concentration in composition, which is the music staff and I basically assembled my own major, basically, where we could pick all the classes that would suit and put them all in, and it was like a build your own major, which is cool.

Mike Hoffman 01:54 Well, you know, that's what, that, that's sort of what the interdisciplinary major is.

Adric Williams 01:58 Yeah.

Mike Hoffman 01:58 Well, very cool. Where are you from originally?

Adric Williams 02:01

So, I am from Chandler, Arizona. Shout out to all my Arizona homies. I was born in Arizona. When I was like three, I moved to Oregon, to Bend for a couple years. I was there for like five years and moved back to Arizona when I was like eight. So, I'm basically in Arizona boy with a little touch of Oregon.

Mike Hoffman 02:20 So, what was it like for you in the church, let's just say in Arizona. I mean, what was it like in that area?

Adric Williams 02:26

The Church in Arizona is very, very welcoming. It's very casual, and anybody can show up and be themselves and express themselves. We've had whole loads of people at my congregation. It's very accepting. There's like a very wide range of ages in our congregation. We have a lot of older folks and also a lot of younger little children who are just absolute delights who, before I moved to Graceland, I would play with after church, and play tag and overdo myself, and make myself sore for the next week. It's a very, very, very loving congregation.

Adric Williams 03:07 This is Chandler congregation?

Mike Hoffman 03:08 Chandler.

Adric Williams 03:09

Yeah, which, by the way, has a really cool new building with some really good audio visuals. Shout out to my dad.

Mike Hoffman 03:17 And you went to camp at Whispering Pines?

Adric Williams 03:19 l did.

Mike Hoffman 03:19 Okay.

Adric Williams 03:20 Yeah.

Mike Hoffman 03:20 Very cool.

Julie Wheaton 03:21

Yeah. Cool. So, I know that you mentioned you're into composing music and things, and so, with that, was there like people at the music faculty that reached out to you to come to Graceland, or why did you choose to come here?

Adric Williams 03:34

So, first of all, I'm a fourth generation student. My family's been here for a long time, fourth generation on my dad's side, third generation on my mom's side. So, my parents have always talked really highly of Graceland my whole life growing up. It was basically just my dream college. And my whole time

growing up I was like, man, I want to go to Graceland. And I heard all these amazing things. I'm like, so excited. I'm just like, oh, I want to, I want to be on Cheville and do all this crazy crap.

Adric Williams 04:05 It was mainly that and it also helps that there wasn't really any universities back in Arizona that particularly appealed to me.

Adric Williams 04:13 Yeah, I didn't feel like going to ASU and being one of millions of students.

Julie Wheaton 04:19 Yeah.

Adric Williams 04:19 Yeah.

Mike Hoffman 04:21 So, did you go to SPEC too?

Adric Williams 04:22 I did.

Mike Hoffman 04:23 Okay. Okay.

Adric Williams 04:24

Yeah, I was at SPEC my freshman year and my senior year, with COVID splitting up my SPEC experience...

Mike Hoffman 04:30 Oh.

Adric Williams 04:30

...but my first year, freshman year, the morning of the flight, I woke up at like two in the morning with a foot infection. My foot was completely swollen. I had a 104 degree fever. So, I missed my flight, went to the ER, had a bunch of tubes in me, but we were able to like move around the tickets where I was able to go later. But I was stuck in crutches the whole time, which stunk *[inaudible]*.

The whole time you were the whole time you were at SPEC?

Adric Williams 04:54

Yeah. Eventually got to the point where I'm like, I'm sick of this. My foot is fine. I could kind of hobble. On the second to last night, there was this, it was called the silent disco where it's like this big rave party thing where everybody's wearing headphones. And there's a photo of me circling the internet somewhere where I'm just like dancing. I'm holding my crutches in the air just like, yeah!

Adric Williams 05:18 Yeah.

Julie Wheaton 05:19

I know, you know, you were on Stewart Manor for a little while, like a semester. How has the house system and like, being a part of jazz band, stuff like that, like how is being a part of that stuff helped, or encouraged your Graceland experience?

Adric Williams 05:35

Yeah, I'll definitely say it definitely pushed me to grow as a person and stretched who I am, I guess, because I came here not knowing anybody, except for one person from my congregation. Hi, Angel.

We hope she's listening.

Adric Williams 05:51

So, I came from like, in Arizona, the bands have this very, in my experience there, like bands have always had, everyone in band has been like really chaotic, very, not really caring about what other people think, and very out there. And that's kind of like the social environment I kind of grew up in. When I got to Graceland, it wasn't exactly that. It was less flamboyant I guess, and that was kind of a shock to me. And it really took me a while to get settled in and find who my friends were, and just like figure out how to act, who to be in these environments. There was a period of time where I just kind of just became really quiet. But I've kind of come out of that. And now I'm just like, slowly being myself, more and more easing into it.

Yeah. And it's definitely helped me with learning about starting over, making friends and all of that sort.

So, it's not uncommon to switch houses. But why Cheville?

Adric Williams 06:51

So, I had heard a lot about Cheville. Actually, it's funny enough, both of my uncles were named Scott, their birthdays are one day apart, they're both scientists, both of their middle names are Allen, a bunch of crazy coincidences, and they were also, I believe they were both on Cheville. I know, one of them was for sure, Scott Miller. I've heard a lot of stories about Cheville and stuff growing up. And I was like, this sounds like definitely the house that I feel like I fit the best in. But when I was filling out the paperwork, I was like, you know, I really don't know a lot about the houses. Maybe there's one I'd be a better fit, so I kind of left it blank. It was just kind of like, throw me in wherever you think I best fit. They put me in Stewart Manor, which is where my dad was, and I didn't really have the best experience in Stewart Manor. It wasn't bad. It was just a very different social environment and lots of football players and I'm a band nerd and I may have been going to like every football game in high school for the past five years, but...

Adric Williams 07:54 Yeah.

And I'm making a reference here to you know, Harry Potter but housing system selection process is interesting, because, you know, it includes everyone. Well, good. So, you think you're going to like Cheville?

Mike Hoffman 08:05 Okay.

Adric Williams 08:06

Yeah, I came to one of their house meetings last year to kind of see how it was. And everywhere I look, it's just this crazy, this is the most band kid energy I've seen since I got to Lamoni. So, it was like, I want to go here.

How would you describe your church experience while you've been at Graceland so far, which I know you really had only one semester under your belt?

Adric Williams 08:28

Yeah.

Mike Hoffman 08:28

And we're still coming out of COVID a little bit anyway, so, but how would you describe that? I mean...

Adric Williams 08:34

So, my history in the church, for most of the time in there, I'd never really paid a lot of attention. I'd never really participated a lot. I'd always go, but wasn't really getting much out of it. And then like, shortly after I graduated high school, I was like, you know what? I've been in here my whole life and like, what have I gotten out of it? So, I've been working on finding, discovering more things about the Church, and like really exploring the Church. I went to a bunch of camps over the summer. And when I came to Graceland, I was welcomed with open arms by the campus ministries team. That's really the first place where I really felt welcomed, and really felt like myself. I've been talking to Mike a lot about different things and participating with lots of stuff, talking about different things going on, learning more about what I want to do in the church. And it's, it's been very beneficial for me.

Adric Williams 09:23 Yeah.

Yeah. So, I know that you mentioned that your major right now is music composition, right?

Adric Williams 09:28 Yeah.

Julie Wheaton 09:28 Which is so cool, by the way.

Adric Williams 09:29 Well, Thank you.

Julie Wheaton 09:30

So, I'm just wondering, what do you plan on like doing with that as your career?

Adric Williams 09:36

Yeah. So ideally, in my fantasy world, well, well, so Shakespeare, he got paid by the queen to write whatever he wanted. That would be a really nice gig, but that's never gonna happen. And I don't want to live on the streets or in my parents' basement. So, there's a couple different branches I could go in. There's of course film scoring with people like John Williams, and I'm blanking on his name, dang it, the guy who wrote *Interstellar*. There's writing soundtracks for video games, which I'm personally very

interested in. And then there's also scoring music for, just based off commission, writing pieces for different ensembles to play for, like different events. And preferably, I'd like to go into either the soundtrack writing for games, or the composing for commissions. That's, all of my biggest influences as a composer has come from composers who do write for commissions like John Mackey, Eric Whitacre, if any y'all recognize those names. Those are like my top two composers. And that's what they do. And it's, I think it's the coolest thing. And I would love to do that. I've also been inspired by a composer/game developer named Toby Fox, who wrote and programmed and designed a couple of games with really phenomenal soundtracks, very different from what I write. But I love the idea of filling up a world with my own music and being the one to create all the different themes and motifs that represent different characters...

Yeah.

Adric Williams 11:06

...and getting to play with them to illustrate different things going on in the story. It's always been the coolest thing to me. So those are the main two paths that I would hope to find success in.

Mike Hoffman 11:17

Yeah. So, while you're at Graceland, we've sort of taken advantage of your skills and desires and where you want to go. You and I've talked about this. You're working on some music for an intro to "Coffee in the Swarm", right?

Adric Williams 11:31 I am.

Mike Hoffman 11:31 Yeah. So, give us a little intro to that. What's it got in it?

Adric Williams 11:37

So, the intro for the Swarm?

Mike Hoffman 11:38 Yeah.

Adric Williams 11:38

Yeah. Okay. So, I started that this morning, actually. So, I took a lot of inspiration from the feel and like emotion from probably my favorite hymn, "For Everyone Born", which I wasn't able to use, but one of my favorite tunes, and when you listen to it, you might notice some inspirations from it. But I also wanted to write a balance, where if you listen to it, it's really interesting and engaging, but it won't distract you from what's going on.

Mike Hoffman 12:06 Yeah.

Adric Williams 12:06

So, I use slower chords, basically. So, it just takes less attention to listen to it, basically. So, it will work in the background. I referenced...

Mike Hoffman 12:18 "The Spirit of God Like a..."

Adric Williams 12:19 Yes.

Mike Hoffman 12:19 "...Fire is burning".

Adric Williams 12:21 Yes.

Mike Hoffman 12:21 Right, right, right, right.

Adric Williams 12:22

I used that hymn. So, the idea is, it's at this point in the intro song, it's going to be in the background soft, soft and quiet. And you hear this hymn play majestically in the background by trombones, French horn and trumpet and going at half the tempo. And I wrote it so, I wanted it to feel like it's soaring. I put it over this chord progression I used earlier in the intro, if anybody knows how that is, where basically I took material that I had earlier in the intro, and I put this melody over it, had it kind of soaring above, with percussion going in the background, creating this soundscape with these different rhythms that don't entirely match up. It's a really cool technique that, I love it when pulled off, right. I'll still reference Graceland University's alma mater in there...

Mike Hoffman 13:08 Yeah.

Adric Williams 13:09 ...with an instrument called the celeste.

Mike Hoffman 13:10 What is that?

Adric Williams 13:11 It's similar to xylophone or glockenspiel.

Mike Hoffman 13:14 Oh, okay. Okay.

Adric Williams 13:15

Yeah, it's basically if you combined those two.

Mike Hoffman 13:16 Okay.

Adric Williams 13:17

So, the main inspirations for this intro was, "For Everyone Born", it was Graceland alma mater, and the "Spirit of God Like a Fire is Burning".

Julie Wheaton 13:26 Yeah. That's super cool...

Mike Hoffman 13:29 It is.

Adric Williams 13:29 Why, thank you.

Julie Wheaton 13:30 ...to hear about the process.

Mike Hoffman 13:31 Yeah.

Julie Wheaton 13:32

So, I know that you had mentioned that you go to Chandler congregation in Arizona, so speaking of Community of Christ, what do you want to see come from Community of Christ? What do you want the future look like?

Adric Williams 13:45

Ooh, I've been putting some thought into this one. I've been thinking about my congregation and the biggest weakness in my specific congregation is that there's, we have a lot of adults, we have a lot of like really young kids, but there's not really anybody in between. It's basically me. There's my friend Angel, who also goes here, and, and then that's about it.

Mike Hoffman 14:03 So....

Adric Williams 14:04 So...

Mike Hoffman 14:04 ...so more young adults.

Adric Williams 14:06

Yes.

Mike Hoffman 14:06 Okay.

Adric Williams 14:06

So, what I want to do is I want to bring in more young adults, and I want to give people a reason to come every week. And I had this crazy idea. I don't know if this is gonna work out when I graduate from Graceland, move and back home, I'm hoping to start experimenting with some of these ideas. But I have just crazy, bonkers idea where what if the Church was just on like, every Sunday it was just open all day and you could come in at any time, and there's couches everywhere, and there's like pool tables and cards, and there's a TV, and basically make it like, instead of a church, make it a community center where people would come whenever they're free and spend some time there, make friends, talk to new people, really have a community. And then maybe on Friday or Saturday nights have a weekly game night or something of the sort that brings people in. If there's like something that breaks the ice between new people coming in. And something I've always wanted to do at my congregation is to do a community arts display, where you invite youth from like all over the neighborhood to create whatever art they like doing, whether it's making a sculpture, making a painting, or a drawing, or making something cool out of Legos.

Mike Hoffman 15:23 So, do you have a background in art?

Adric Williams 15:25

I am a very creative man. My creativity is mostly in music writing. Every now and then I'll sit down and do a little bit of visual art...

Mike Hoffman 15:34 Okay.

Adric Williams 15:34 ... and it's not the work.

Mike Hoffman 15:36

It's just like all of a sudden, this art idea, which I think is really cool. Absolutely cool, yeah, so.

Adric Williams 15:41

'Cause my thought behind this is when I was a freshman in high school, I was writing all this music, and I was so excited about it, I loved it, and there wasn't really anywhere to take it. And I'm like, envisioning, what if, once every, like six months or something, the whole community came together and everybody showed off all this art they did? And you could have a little open mic recital, where anybody who writes music can sing their songs or play something on piano or violin, or whatever their instrument is, and anybody can express themselves in any way they want.

Mike Hoffman 16:12

Yeah.

Adric Williams 16:12 And I think that would be a great way to bring the community together.

Mike Hoffman 16:16 Yeah.

Adric Williams 16:17 Everybody would have this common interest in creating things.

Mike Hoffman 16:19 Yeah.

Adric Williams 16:20

And then, you know what? Maybe there's a bunch of musicians here, and maybe we'll want to make a cool little, at home, Afterglow band, you know.

Mike Hoffman 16:27

Yeah. *[inaudible]* and may not be familiar. Afterglow is our Wednesday night worship, which is now our primary worship on campus now, and it is led by a student band that Julie participates in. And have you been involved?

Adric Williams 16:43 Not yet. I plan to.

Mike Hoffman 16:44

Okay, okay, cool. And it's got, I don't know, six or eight people, and it rotates, and singers, and your idea is to have Afterglow back in your home congregation then.

Adric Williams 16:53 Yeah.

Mike Hoffman 16:54 Sort of like that.

Adric Williams 16:54 Yes, something of the sort.

Mike Hoffman 16:56 Yeah.

Adric Williams 16:57

And like, it doesn't really have to be that. It could just be a little community band...

Mike Hoffman 17:00 Yeah.

Adric Williams 17:01

...that may be, every now and then, could come in and play at our church services. And then kind of bring that new voice into it.

Mike Hoffman 17:08 Yeah.

Adric Williams 17:08 And then that would also bring in other younger folks.

Mike Hoffman 17:10 Yeah.

Adric Williams 17:11 You know.

Mike Hoffman 17:11 Yeah, yeah. Which is the whole purpose of where you [inaudible], so.

Adric Williams 17:14 Exactly.

Mike Hoffman 17:15 So, yeah, so.

Adric Williams 17:17

Yeah. Oh, and why not the cherry on top of this crazy idea, would to be, to have an espresso machine, and teach all the pastors how to make espressos. And somebody could come in, and there would always be like, there's always two pastors or priests there at a time. And they could like, show you around, kind of introduce you to anybody who's there, show you where everything is, and then make you a nice cup of coffee. And then you can maybe do some homework, or you can just sit and talk on the couch.

Adric Williams 17:43 Do, you know whatever?

Mike Hoffman 17:44 Cool, very cool, yeah.

Julie Wheaton 17:46

These are really cool ideas, by the way, super cool.

Adric Williams 17:48

Why, thank you.

Julie Wheaton 17:49

So, if you could sit down with the president of Community of Christ, what do you think you would say to him?

Adric Williams 17:56

Ooh, that's a good question. If I sat down with him, I would tell him that I want, that we should reimagine what church is and expand on the ideas. 'Cause part of where the idea came from was when I was a kid, the church service would end. I'd be like, Mom, Dad, let's go. I don't want to be here. There's nothing to do, while they're all talking and socializing with all their friends, and if we made every church a place where people would want to be, where kids would want to be, where young adults would want to be, and older adults, then...

Adric Williams 18:31

...that would bring people in, you know. I want to reimagine our churches and congregations as somewhere that you don't want to leave after church.

Julie Wheaton 18:39 Yeah.

Mike Hoffman 18:39 Yeah.

Julie Wheaton 18:40 That's a good point. Yeah,

Mike Hoffman 18:42 But not just older people, everybody wants to stay.

Adric Williams 18:43 Everybody.

Mike Hoffman 18:45

So, is there anything else you'd like to share with us today about Graceland, about the Church, about you and your future?

Adric Williams 18:51

We've already, you and I have talked about maybe working on a piece for baccalaureate at the end of the year...

...or something, so yeah, so. Well, it makes sense to me. Like you've come to Graceland, any student comes to Graceland, and we need to try to match up what you want to do with learning about it here, you know.

Adric Williams 19:22 I, thank you guys for inviting me.
