Yeah, so I'm assuming you went to church camps, went to SPEC. [Oh yes] all that. So how is that for you?

So, you would have gone back to senior high camp. Oh, it was so fun. Growing up, I went when I was really little, and then I took a break because I started playing volleyball, and it was more competitive volleyball, and so I have to do a lot of, like, summer conditioning and training in the summer, so I wouldn't get to go to camp. And then I started going again, like, after COVID, I went to SPEC for the first time. And going to SPEC made me realize, like, oh, I need to start going back to camps, because this was so much fun. Okay, so what brought you to Graceland?

Callie Dennis 03:08

Did you have any other schools in mind when you were applying to colleges? Or was were you kind of set in stone? Well, it was, it was a multitude of reasons. Honestly, I had a lot of strong family influence to come here. I grew up hearing stories about, you know, the good old times at Graceland, and then Danny, my older brother came or he still is here.
